



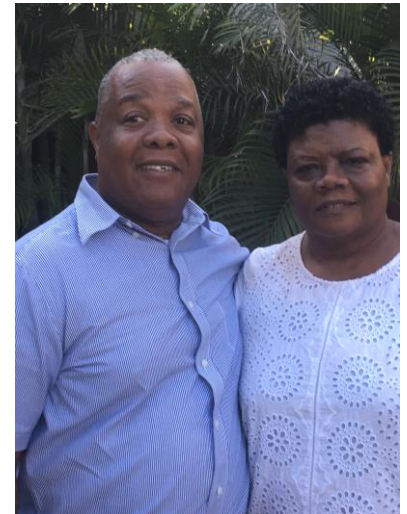

The perpetrators of this heinous and villainous crime are not behind bars where they belong. Consequently Haiti is living the darkest days of its history. It is a perpetual

nightmare in daylight. Have we ever seen such a chaos in the land created a political vacuum? To top it all, a 7.2 earthquake hit the South of Haiti, leaving destruction and death here and there all along its route.

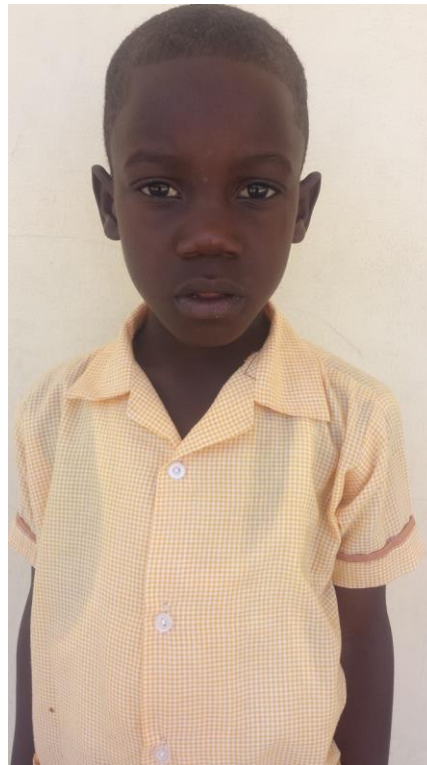
## **Global Christian Mission Outreach's Child Sponsorship Program**

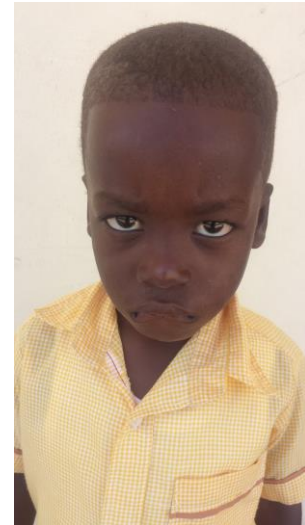

Many of them come to school hungry, hoping to be served a hot meal for lunch. There are also classes to be started at Tom Gato and at Cambry.

We can't make it without you. Without your help many children will be turned down this school year.

They will be denied the unique opportunity to learn about Math, Reading, and Social Studies. More importantly, they will be denied the greater opportunity to learn about Bible stories, creation, and our Lord Jesus Christ.

Would you please fill out an application to sponsor one child every month at least for one year? With only thirty dollars a month, one dollar a day, you can make a big difference in the life of a child in a little village of your choice.
