Thanksgiving has always been a precious tradition for us and our family as well. We celebrate with you all today this special holiday. This is a history of courage and perseverance and the birthing of a great giant of a nation. We are reminded of the perilous trips the pilgrims made on board of the Mayflower in search of this land of freedom. They have found it and created this great nation in the heart of the new world.

They celebrated their first Thanksgiving right here in Plymouth, MA in November of 1621. What a Christian heritage that your forefathers have worked so hard to leave behind that we all celebrate and cherish so dearly today.

Thanksgiving is the spirit of sharing. Thanksgiving is the spirit of oneness and togetherness as it is engraved in our hearts and in our consciousness: "*E Pluribus Unum*" which means "*out of many, one.*" Thanksgiving is an attitude of the spirit. Let us all come together with praise and thanksgiving around the table for all the great things He has done. Count the many blessings and name them one by one. We all got so much to be thankful for.

We are so thankful for the gift of family. As you all know, Claudie and I have three adult children: Marc, Ricardo and Melissa. But the family keeps expanding. We

have today three grandchildren... Marcus, Alexander and Fahani. They are real treasures that we can't have enough of.

We are also thankful for our faithful friends and partners like you who have empowered us to do the work in this country of Haiti. The years passed by quickly and you continue to be the backbone of this ministry. We could not do what we are presently doing without your ongoing prayers and constant support. Claudie and I we love you all so dearly and we cherish your friendship, and more importantly, your partnership in the ministry of the gospel.

Here in the field, there is such a dim prospective for the future. The social and political situation continue to worsen to say the least: The gangs continue their reign of terror. The police forces seem to be absent or simply said their presence is not felt. We got all kinds of police forces, namely: BRI, BOYD, BLTS, BIM, SIMO, and SWAT and so on, they all equal less than zero. And

the people are abandoned to themselves to live a nightmare in daylight. And rightly so, the police forces are accused of being incompetent. To this, they replied they have not received orders from their superiors to intervene.

Meanwhile, the situation continues to be chaotic. And, the horror movie is unfolding before our very eyes every day. As a matter of course, a plethora of young men and women are fleeing Port-Au-Prince in massive numbers to go to wherever. It becomes very difficult to travel from one point to another without running the risk of being sequestrated, kidnapped or just being killed. However the enemies are not foreign coming from miles away; they are domestic enemies fighting the very existence of our beloved nation. The real enemies are corrupted rich oligarchs fighting for a monopoly. They are more interested about their benefits than the welfare of the citizens. The real enemies are corrupted politicians working in conjunction with the gangs in order to perpetuate themselves in power rather than protecting the country they swear to defend. Most of the times the election ballots are filled before elections could even be scheduled. Meanwhile the beloved nation is crying for help. Haiti is plunging slowly into the infernal abyss, and shame is covering our face.

However in this atmosphere of chaos and uncertainty our cohort of brothers and sisters in Christ continue to work. The churches in Haiti are alive and well, even during these stressful times. We need to press on while it is still daylight for the night comes when no one can work.

Delmas Christian Church continues to press on despite the seemingly perilous times. On October 28, 2022, Brother Vincent launched an evangelistic campaign for Grand-Fond and Laval, Anse-a-Veau. The trip was difficult indeed; the gangs blocked the roads where they were supposed to cross. They bypassed the main road to take a detour through Savanne Pistache. In doing so, they were wandering around and got

lost in the mountains. God used the very members of the gangs to show them the way and they were finally able to reach their destination. The word of Proverbs sum it up, "When a man's ways, please the Lord, He maketh even his enemies to be at peace with him." (Proverbs 16:7 KJV)

The trip has lasted several hours, the delegation consisting of seven men eager to share the good news to a lost community unloaded at Anse-a-Veau. They went from house to house presented the gospel message during a whole week going from October 28 until

November 2, 2022. The result was astonishing: 641 men and women heard the Word, 33 men and women have accepted the Lord as personal Savior, and three others who used to go to church were restored to their Christian Faith and are now active in their

respective congregation. Alleluia to the Lord of hosts.

Christville Christian Church continues to strive hard for excellence. A plethora of young men and women in mass are turning to the Church. They are searching for answers to the dilemma of life. The pews are filled to capacity each Sunday. The good news of His imminent return is being heralded and many have answered the call. The situation is getting


harder and harder everywhere but we do not lose hope. The apostle Paul said it better, "But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the Excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us. 
Special Announcement




Pastor Va following cataract surgery

We can't make it without you. Without your help many children will be turned down this school year. They will be denied the unique opportunity to learn about Math, Reading, and Social Studies. More importantly, they will be denied the greater opportunity to learn about Bible stories, creation, and our Lord Jesus Christ.
